

TEXAS LOW-LEVEL RADIOACTIVE WASTE DISPOSAL COMPACT COMMISSION

Order Authorizing the Export of Waste

Texas A&M University

On July 31, 2009 the Texas Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Compact Commission ("Commission") received from the Texas A&M University ("TAMU") five Petitions (two of were withdrawn 17 August) to Export Class A Low-Level Radioactive Waste for Treatment and Permanent Disposal ("Petitions") at the following locations:

- Petition One: Perma-Fix; Gainesville, FL
- Petition Two: DSSI/Perma-Fix; Kingston, TN
- Petition Three: Duratek, Inc/EnergySolutions; Oak Ridge, TN./Clive, UT

The Petitions were filed pursuant to Section 3.05(7) of the Texas Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Compact and the Resolution to Consider Export Petitions Pursuant to Texas Compact (P.L. 105-236) Section 3.05(7), which was adopted by the Commission at its July 21, 2009 meeting.


By a vote of 6-0, with one abstention, at the Commission's meeting posted for August 19, 2009, a majority of the members of the Commission approved the Petitions filed by TAMU on the terms stated in the Petitions, subject only to the following terms and conditions:

1. TAMU will supply to the Commission:
 - a. Manifests and/or reports of volume, mass, and activity sent for processing and ultimate disposal which are satisfactory to the Commission.
 - b. Final reconciliation of waste volume concluded not later than 180 days post Order period.
2. The period of the shipment of the waste from the site of generation is authorized as effective from the date as submitted in the Petitions and shall expire at the end of the day on 30 September 2010 for all materials requested in the petitions submitted to the Commission.
3. Granting of this Order does not preclude the Commission's consideration of the imposition of export fees at a future date, which fees might be applicable to the export of waste under this Order.

The original order was amended 22 January 2010 to include material from Texas A&M University – Kingsville. The petition requesting the change was filed in a request dated 21 January 2010.

It is hereby ordered that Texas A&M University is authorized to export low-level radioactive waste as requested in the Petitions, subject to the terms and condition as stated in this Order. The Petitions are attached to this Order.
